

SAT Punctuation

When answering <u>Language Questions</u>, always determine what is **DIFFERENT** (**changing**) in the answer choices. THAT is the concept on which you are being tested.

If you're being tested on **with-in sentence punctuation**, remember THESE rules:

STOP punctuation can link only		ideas.	
HALF STOP punctuation is	by a		idea.
GO punctuation links	except	complete	
ideas.			



STOP punctuation includes:

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If you're being tested on with-in sentence punctuation, do the VERTICAL LINE TEST!

Draw a vertical line (in answer choices & question) where punctuation changes.
Read up to that line. (Is it a complete sentence idea?) Read after that line. (Is it a complete sentence idea?)
